Bible reading for Today – Ezra 1:1-5

¹ In the first year of Cyrus king of Persia, in order to fulfil the word of the LORD spoken by Jeremiah, the LORD moved the heart of Cyrus king of Persia to make a proclamation throughout his realm and also to put it in writing:

² 'This is what Cyrus king of Persia says:

"The LORD, the God of heaven, has given me all the kingdoms of the earth and he has appointed me to build a temple for him at Jerusalem in Judah. ³ Any of his people among you may go up to Jerusalem in Judah and build the temple of the LORD, the God of Israel, the God who is in Jerusalem, and may their God be with them. ⁴ And in any locality where survivors may now be living, the people are to provide them with silver and gold, with goods and livestock, and with freewill offerings for the temple of God in Jerusalem."

⁵Then the family heads of Judah and Benjamin, and the priests and Levites – everyone whose heart God had moved – prepared to go up and build the house of the LORD in Jerusalem.

Reopening Sunday 5th July: In line with Phase 3 of the reopening roadmap, services will be held in church next Sunday: 9:30 Killymard, 10:45 Laghey, 12:00 Donegal. A separate letter will be going out with full details of how this will work. The key messages are: **1. DO NOT come if you have COVID symptoms** (fever, cough, breathing difficulties). **2. Maintain social distancing** of 2m. **3. Sanitise hands** on entry and exit. Please arrive early to allow for orderly entry and seating (some pews will be blocked off to maintain social distancing). Consider government advice on face coverings and cocooning for the vulnerable. Note that there will be no Holy Communion or singing for the time being. The services will be shortened to approx 30 mins and the 12.00noon service will be live-streamed to our Facebook Page.
