Donegal, Killymard, Lough Eske and Laghey 5th Sept 2021 – 14th Sunday after Trinity

Bible Reading for Today - James 2:1-4, 8-9, 12-17

¹ My brothers and sisters, believers in our glorious Lord Jesus Christ must not show favouritism. ² Suppose a man comes into your meeting wearing a gold ring and fine clothes, and a poor man in filthy old clothes also comes in. ³ If you show special attention to the man wearing fine clothes and say, 'Here's a good seat for you,' but say to the poor man, 'You stand there' or 'Sit on the floor by my feet,' 4 have you not discriminated among yourselves and become judges with evil thoughts? ...

⁸ If you really keep the royal law found in Scripture, 'Love your neighbour as yourself, you are doing right. 9 But if you show favouritism, you sin and are convicted by the law as law-breakers... ¹² Speak and act as those who are going to be judged by the law that gives freedom, 13 because judgment without mercy will be shown to anyone who has not been merciful. Mercy triumphs over

¹⁴What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if someone claims to have faith but has no deeds? Can such faith save them? ¹⁵ Suppose a brother or a sister is without clothes and daily food. ¹⁶ If one of you says to them, 'Go in peace; keep warm and well fed,' but does nothing about their physical needs, what good is it? ¹⁷ In the same way, faith by itself, if it is not accompanied by action, is dead.

The right way is summed up in the command, 'Love your neighbour as yourself,' which James calls Scripture's 'royal law.' What things in this passage do you find most challenging?
